10.40-11:40	<b>Vocabulary and Reading</b> Examine the use of fairy tales in a cultural context.	<b>Grammar</b> Revise modal verbs in present, past and future.	<b>Reading</b> Environmental disasters; related questions and comments.	<b>Reading</b> Students read articles related to personal adventures or experiences.	<b>Vocabulary and Speaking</b> Work with idioms, phrasal verbs and colloquialisms, using vocabulary from the week's materials.
11.40-12.40	<b>Writing</b> In groups, write an imaginary tale based on picture prompts.	<b>Reading</b> Read an extended text and answer comprehension questions.	<b>Grammar and Speaking</b> Use conditionals to discuss likelihood and probability.	<b>Writing</b> Students write an account of a personal experience. Use of appropriate tenses for narrative purposes.	<b>Pronunciation activities</b> Jazz chants, tongue twisters and role plays.
<b>Afternoon</b>	Students can join optional Workshops or social activities through the <b>myEssentials</b> or <b>Hawthorn Activity Program</b>				
<b>Homework:</b>	Review vocabulary from Reading and Listening.	Complete comprehension questions.	Listen to news broadcasts, note conditional language.	Complete narrative writing to submit.
